#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Looks like we may be in for a warm wet winter - no doubt the effect of El Nino which will bring drought to other parts of Australia. The worst El Nino was in 1982-1983 when Australia experienced very severe drought, bushfires (Ash Wednesday) and extensive farm losses.

In normal years (La Nina) cold water travels up the Pacific coast of South America to the equator and crosses the Pacific from east to west getting warmer on the way and associating with the south east trade winds which in turn drag the water westwards. This causes an air circulation. The air warming as it reaches Australia (and Indonesia in particular) and rising above Indonesia to cross the Pacific from west to east then descending near Peru. This is called the Walker Circulation.

Fluctuations in the intensity of this circulation result in the Southern Oscillation, the strength of which is proportional to the difference in pressure between Indonesia and the eastern South Pacific. The Southern Oscillation Index is a measure of the pressure difference between Tahiti and Darwin. It is very high when the Indonesian pressure is low. This means the western Pacific is wet and dry stable conditions occur in South America. When the SOI is low, Indonesia is dry and South America warm and moist. When it is very low (negative) we have the infamous El Nino. Warm water occurs off Peru. The trade winds are less intense and there is a reduction in motion west across the Pacific. Upwelling of cold water off South America is reduced and sea temperatures rise as warm water moves easterly causing underlying cold water to sink deeply. This eastward spread occurs as pulses close to the equator taking 2 - 3 months to cross the ocean. The water level rises in the eastern Pacific and moves poleward.

So it is not all doom and gloom for us here in Cairns - we will still get some rain. But remember to remain water-wise or you will be paying for it with cold, hard cash. Did you get your excess water bill? Now for some housekeeping.

As we have no tuckerologist, it has been decided that everyone should take a turn at this noble profession. If you do not volunteer at meetings then victims will be chosen alphabetically. It is not a hard job. All it entails is taking home the cups for washing then bringing them back next meeting with a carton of milk and a couple of packets of biscuits unless you are a pastry cook (then you can bake a cake). If you cannot attend the meeting please arrange for someone else to do the job.

The plant raffles that raised a few dollars at meetings have failed by the wayside. Please try to grow a few seeds or cuttings so we can have raffles again. We don't all have the same plants in our gardens and you may have one that is desired by someone else.

We had to dip out of Tropical Garden Expo this year because of lack of plants and bodies to organise and set up the show. After seeing the displays that were low key this year in comparison to some of the previous spectaculars we could have easily set up our static show display. It was a missed opportunity to attract public interest.

Remember that the show set-up replaces the July meeting on Tuesday evening. Bring flowers, fruits, foliage and plants - anything that makes a display. Friends of the Botanic Gardens festival is Sunday 6 September. We will be having a stall and display. Please! Please! Start potting something. This is our only fund raising event and we need the money to pay the rent for our meetings. Remember that we pay for the plant you grow so you are not out of pocket. We really need some keen growers. Have a go!

Sunday 14 June is excursion day. Tony is taking us to a new area near Irvinebank and Watsonville. Meet at 10 am at the Tin Pannikin Museum at Herberton. We always have a great day. It is a chance to meet other people particularly Tableland members and it is an opportunity to learn some dry country plants.
